### Common Written Examination (CWE) for recruitment of Officers in RRBs

### I. Process for Arriving at Standard Scores

The Standard Scores are obtained by adopting the following procedure:

- (i) Number of questions answered correctly by a candidate in each objective test is considered for arriving at the Corrected Score after applying penalty for wrong answers.
- (ii) The Corrected Scores so obtained are <u>standardized\*</u> to arrive at Final Standard Score with a minimum '0' and maximum '40' by following Linear Transformation Method.

This procedure is followed for each of the tests.

\* The corrected scores in each test are scaled to Standardised Scores with Mean 20 and Standard Deviation 4

### Note: Cutoffs were applied in two stages:

- (i) on standard scores in individual tests
- (ii) on Total Weighted Standard Score

The details of the cutoffs applied on Standard Scores in individual tests and on Total Weighted Standard Score (TWSS) is given below at (II) and (IV) respectively.

<u>For Officer Scale-I-</u> Total Weighted Standard Score = Standard Scores obtained in (Reasoning  $\times$  1.25 + Quantitative Aptitude  $\times$  1.25 + General Awareness  $\times$  1.00 + English Language/ Hindi Language  $\times$  1.00 + Computer Knowledge  $\times$  0.50)

<u>For Officer Scale-II (GBO) and Officer Scale-III-</u> Total Weighted Standard Score = Standard Scores obtained in (Reasoning  $\times$  1.25 + Quantitative Aptitude & Data Interpretation  $\times$  1.25 + Financial Awareness  $\times$  1.00 + English Language/ Hindi Language  $\times$  1.00 + Computer Knowledge  $\times$  0.50)

For Officer Scale-II in Specialist Cadre- Total Weighted Standard Score = Standard Scores obtained in (Reasoning  $\times$  1.00 + Quantitative Aptitude & Data Interpretation  $\times$  1.00 + Financial Awareness  $\times$  1.00 + English Language/ Hindi Language  $\times$  0.50 + Computer Knowledge  $\times$  0.50 + Professional Knowledge  $\times$  1.00)
