Recruitment of Constable (GD) in CAPFs and Rifleman(GD) in Assam Rifles, 2012- List of candidates qualified for appearing in the Medical Examination.

The Staff Selection Commission conducted an examination for recruitment to the post of Constable G.D in CAPF and Rifleman in Assam Rifle Examination, 2012 on 22.4.2012 at various centres scattered all over the country. A total number of 7,05,832 candidates appeared for the examination. In accordance with the instructions in the OMR Sheet and Notice of the Examination, 1,01,311 candidates (77,206 candidates in morning session and 24,105 candidates in evening session) have been awarded 'zero' marks on various grounds.

2. As per the scheme of the Recruitment, the minimum cut off percentage marks in the written examination is normally 33% for SC, ST and OBC candidates and 35% for UR and Ex-Servicemen candidates.

3. For preparation of Result, Category, Gender and State/Border and Naxal/Militancy Codes of candidates have been taken from the Unverified Data sent by Regional Offices, as decided by the Commission.

4. Candidates whose Gender column was blank have been considered as Male candidates.

5. Vacancies have been received from MHA for all the CPOs for year 2012-13 and Backlog vacancies for the year 2011-12 in Assam Rifles. The Commission has released 04 lists of candidates for Detailed Medical Examination :-

Keeping in view the tentative vacancies in each State/UT, Commission has fixed the following cut-off for Male candidates in 1:4 ratio approximately :-

All the Candidates qualified in List-I in the above 13 States/UTs will be considered for vacancies reserved for Naxal/Militancy Affected Districts in these State/UTs also. For 4 States viz. Chattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh also, all the candidates qualified in List-I will be considered for vacancies reserved for Naxal/Militancy affected Districts too. However, for these 4 States, a list of additional candidates is being released at a lower cut-off *vis-a-vis* List-I for candidates domiciled in Naxal/Militancy affected Districts as below :-

All the Candidates qualified in List-I in the 13 States/UTs mentioned above will be considered for vacancies reserved for Border Districts in these State/UTs also. For 4 States viz. Punjab, Rajasthan, U.P. and Uttarakhand, all the candidates qualified in List-I will be considered for vacancies reserved for Border Districts too. However for these 4 States, a lower cut-off was fixed vis-a-vis List-I for candidates domiciled in Border Districts as below :-

6.(d). **List IV : Candidates qualified against unfilled vacancies in deficit State/UTs, if any, after finalization of the Select List.**

Commission has decided in consultation with MHA and the CAPFs to call additional candidates for Detailed Medical Examination in order to consider them against shortfall in candidates vis-a-vis vacancies in deficit States/UTs, if any. The cut-off adopted for such State/UTs is as below :-

29,594 additional Male candidates are available at the prescribed cut-off in the above States. Commission has decided that these candidates will be considered against aggregated shortfall, if any, in the Reserve List after considering the candidates in List-I, II and III for vacancies available in the respective State/UTs in order of merit and option exercised for CAPFs.

7. To sum up, following Male candidates are available in each of the four Lists :-

List-I : **1,23,640 (State-wise)**

List-II: **1,443 (Additional for Naxal/Militancy affected Districts)**

List-III: **4,096 (Additional for Border Districts)**

List-IV: **29,594 (Additional for Reserve List)**

List-I has no common candidate with other Lists. Between List-II and List-IV there are 187 common candidates, between List-III and List-IV there are 661 common candidates and between List-II and List-III there are 243 common candidates. Each candidate will be called for Medical Examination only once.

8. The result of 3004 candidates has been withheld for verification of entries in the OMR answer sheet. Their result will be processed in due course.

9. The list is PROVISIONAL. The candidates whose roll numbers figure in the list would be called for Medical Examination subject to their fulfilling all the eligibility conditions/requirements as prescribed for the post in the Notice of Examination and also subject to thorough verifications of their identity with reference to their photographs, signatures, handwriting, etc., on the application forms, admission certificates, etc. If on verification from the application form, it is found that any candidate does not fulfill any of the eligibility conditions, he/she will not be eligible to appear for the Medical Examination. The Commission causes further verification of details in the OMR sheets of the candidates and also undertakes post examination/posts, result analysis of OMR sheets to detect incidence of malpractices. Therefore, the result of the written examination are placed on the website, subject to such verification/analysis.

10. Particulars of the candidates including their category status as indicated in the result have been taken from their OMR answer scripts. It is important for such candidates for whom certain percentage of vacancies are reserved as per the policy of the Govt., to note that if any of them does not actually belong to the category shown against his/her roll number, he/she may not be eligible for appearing in the Medical Examination. It is, therefore, in the interest of such candidates to contact the concerned Regional Offices of the Staff Selection Commission immediately in all such cases where they do not belong to the category shown against their roll numbers in the result. Similarly, if there is mismatch between roll numbers and name, such candidates should also contact the regional offices.

11. Medical Examination of the qualified candidates will be scheduled by the concerned Regional Offices of the Commission. Candidates are advised to follow the website of the concerned regional offices. The facility of downloading of the call letters will also be available from the concerned website of the regional offices. Tentatively, Medical Examination, in batches, will commence from **02.07.2012** in different centres.

12. It may be noted that in case of delay in receipt of call letters, candidates will be allowed to report to the Medical Examination centre on subsequent days within one week of the date assigned to the candidates in the call letter or completion of the medical examination, whichever is earlier.
