

BSF to train youths in 3 border districts of Gujarat

The training will help the youths with the recruitment examinations of the Assam Rifles, defence forces, home guards and police and para-military forces, the release added.

As part of its Skill Development Programme, the Border Security Force (BSF) will train 800-1000 youths from three border districts of Gujarat – Patan, Banaskantha and Kutch – for employment in defence and paramilitary forces, said a Gujarat government release Tuesday. The training will help the youths with the recruitment examinations of the Assam Rifles, defence forces, home guards and police and para-military forces, the release added.

The BSF will be imparting training at its campuses in Gandhinagar, Dantiwada, Bhuj and Gandhidham. The training will include preparation for physical capability, physical training, written examination and escort duty. Each team of 50 youths will be given training for 30 days, during which they will also be provided with food, accommodation, uniform and physical training kits.

The BSF has made arrangements with private security agencies to secure youths who do not clear the exam employment with a monthly salary of Rs 10,000-12,000.
