Tata Trusts, NSDC tie up for jobs to state youth

Tata Trusts and National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) joined hands today to promote skill development and jobs for youth from Jammu and Kashmir.

To accelerate the pace of skill development, the two entities tied up for a study to be undertaken by Dalberg Global Development Advisers aimed at understanding the aspirations of the youth from the state and identifying the key challenges and interventions that could create a better impact by way of employment opportunities with corporates.
