

Recruitment process of NPSC Qualified candidates starts from July

The Nagaland Public Service Commission (NPSC) has announced the results of the NCS, NPS, NSS & Allied Services (Preliminary) Examination 2011, held on 23rd July, 2011. This was notified in a press note issued by Sarah R. Ritse Secretary, NPSC Kohima.

After a long wait, finally the Nagaland Public Service Commission (NPSC) has finally declared the result of written examination for the advertisement in 2014. So all the candidates who are waiting for the NPSC Results can now access from the official website. As per the official notification around 330 candidates have qualified for the next process of recruitment. The Result of the 2014 NCS, NPS, NSS & Allied Services Exam. The NPSC had issued an advertisement various categories of posts on May 5, 2014. So for the next process of recruitment all the qualified candidates need to attend which would commence from July 1st, 2016. The Nagaland Public Service Commission have successfully conducted the examination for all the applicants who have applied to it. NPSC Results 2016 will be available in a pdf format on the official website of the NPSC. The Nagaland Public Service Commission will recruit candidates for various posts under the government of Nagaland. It will notify the candidates regarding the exam timetable and conducts the exam. Like every year, the commission has notified regarding the NPSC NCS, NPS, NSS and Allied Services Exam 2014 and invited the aspirants for the exam. All the interested applicants have submitted their applications via online and have successfully attended the written examination.

The next process of the NPSC Results 2016 is the Viva- voice which would commence from 1st of July this year. Further, NPSC has informed that the post of District Transport Officer has been stayed by the High Court, while Art & Culture department has withdrawn the Research Assistant and Record Sorter post from the advertisement in view of the High Court order.
