### **Important instructions to the candidates**

1. Application fees once paid shall not be refunded under any circumstances
2. Applications incomplete in any respect and those received after the last date shall not be entertained
3. The University shall verify the antecedents or documents submitted by a candidate at any time at the time of appointment or during the tenure of the service. In case, it is detected that the documents submitted by the candidates are fake or the candidate has a clandestine antecedents/background and has suppressed the said information, then his services shall be terminated.
4. In case of any inadvertent mistake in the process of selection which may be detected any stage even after the issue of appointment letter, the University reserves the right to modify/withdraw/cancel any communication made to the candidates
5. In case of any dispute/ambiguity that may occur in the process of selection, the decision of the University shall be final.
6. Candidates should send self-attested copies of certificates and mark-sheets from matriculation onwards in support of their qualifications. Originals should not be sent along with the application but these must be produced at the time of interview
7. Candidates are advised to satisfy themselves before applying that they possess at least the minimum essential qualifications laid down for each post, in this advertisement.
8. No correspondence will be entertained regarding postal delays, conduct and result of interview and reasons for not being called for interview, etc.
9. Canvassing in any form will result in disqualification
10. Only shortlisted candidates will be called for interview.
